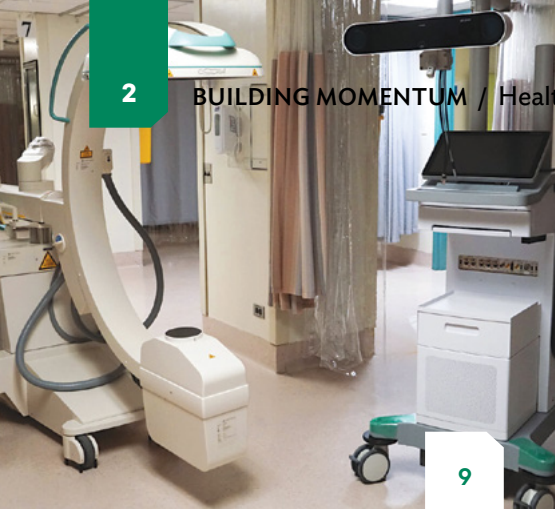

Thanks to your confidence and generosity, the HSC Foundation has enjoyed yet another tremendous year, generating over \$38 million in gross revenue and surpassing \$100 million in assets.

This strong financial performance allows us to serve as a catalyst and change-maker as we dream big alongside our colleagues at Health Sciences Centre—Manitoba’s hospital. Thanks to the steady momentum of our Operation Excellence campaign, over \$23 million has already been invested in new equipment and critical facility enhancements—with more progress taking shape even as you read this. These investments are bearing fruit as new surgeons have been attracted, and many surgical patients are already benefitting from the use of new, minimally invasive equipment.

In addition to Operation Excellence, the Foundation took a major leap forward last year by acquiring the Manitoba Clinic building, adjacent to HSC. We were able to acquire the building at a fair market price using credit facilities. No donated money was used in the purchase, and the building has been generating revenue for the Foundation since December 2023.

We purchased the building to help pave the way for future expansion and redevelopment of the HSC campus so that Manitoba’s hospital can serve the community optimally for generations to come. You can read more about the Manitoba Clinic purchase in this report, along with articles about minimally invasive surgery, our strategic planning process, and more.

As you peruse these pages, we hope that you will share in our excitement and optimism for the months and years ahead as we continue to fund positive developments at HSC for the benefit of patients and their loved ones.

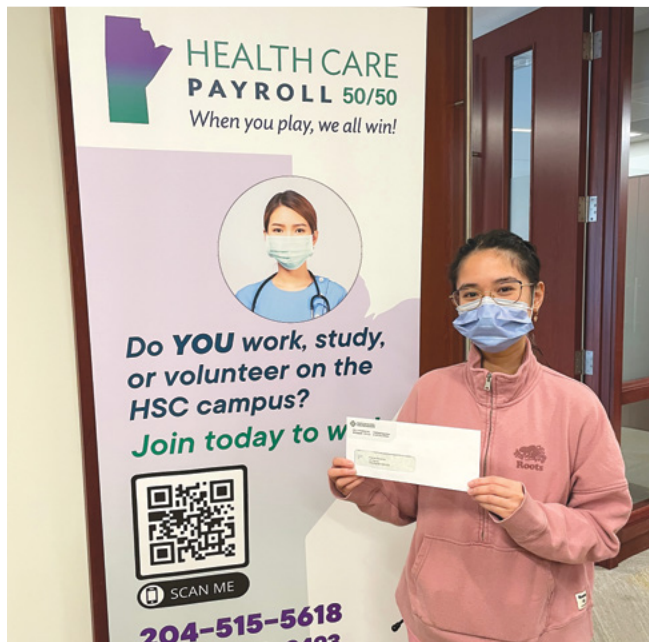

Year at a Glance: 2023/2024

The 2023/2024 fiscal year was yet another success story for the HSC Foundation. We generated over \$38 million in revenue and surpassed \$100 million in assets. The year also featured four major announcements: the landmark acquisition of the Manitoba Clinic building; the unveiling of Unit B5B for neurosurgery step-down; the appointment of a donor-funded chair in Technology for Assisted Living; and the unveiling of the redeveloped, state-of-the-art Plastic Surgery Clinic. We are grateful for the trust and generosity of our donors, for the engagement of our partners, and for the productive relationships we enjoy with medical and administrative leaders at HSC. We are all working together to deliver tomorrow's health care, today.

Here are a few HSC Foundation highlights from 2023/2024:

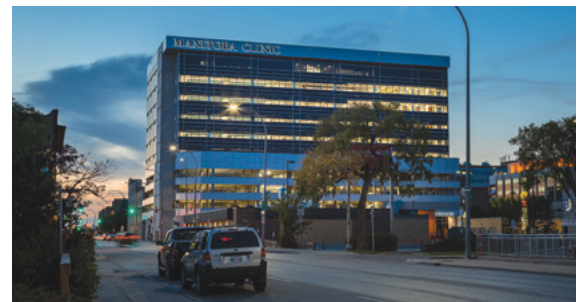


On **May 1, 2023**, we launched the **Manitoba Health Care Payroll 50/50**. By August 30, 2024, the initiative had attracted over 6,800 subscribers and had generated over \$717,000 in net revenue for the HSC Foundation.

The **Tri-Hospital Dream Lottery**—held in partnership with the Children's Hospital Foundation of Manitoba and the St. Boniface Hospital Foundation—wrapped up in **July 2023** and generated \$815,000 in net revenue for the HSC Foundation in support of patient care initiatives at HSC.



On **June 22, 2023**, we officially unveiled RR4—the redeveloped, \$1.8 million donor-funded **Plastic Surgery Clinic** with the first-of-its-kind in Canada procedure room. With new equipment and redeveloped space, many patients who would otherwise be scheduled for surgery in the hospital's main operating rooms, can be treated in the clinic as an outpatient. This means better outcomes for patients and a reduced burden on the operating rooms.



On **August 2, 2023**, we announced the signing of an agreement to acquire the **Manitoba Clinic building** to help expedite the redevelopment of the HSC Campus. The deal closed in December 2023. For more information, see page 23.



On **November 6, 2023**, we announced a partnership between the Health Sciences Centre Foundation and the University of Manitoba to fund a new, \$3 million research chair in **Technology for Assisted Living**. Thanks to HSC Foundation donors' contribution of \$1.5 million, and UM donors' contribution of \$1.5 million, the two organizations introduced Dr. Jacquie Ripat as the Endowed Chair in Technology for Assisted Living. The Technology for Assisted Living initiative is an important milestone in virtual care as research will be focused on helping people stay at home safely and live independently for as long as possible.

Third-Party Events



The HSC Foundation is grateful for donations from our committed community partners. Through special events and initiatives, businesses, community groups, and individuals unite to support our mission. **This year, we are thrilled to highlight The WKND Salon & Aesthetics who donated \$1,850 to the HSC Foundation, including \$1,600 in proceeds from their grand opening event.**

The annual **HSC Millionaire Lottery** wrapped up in **November 2023** with gross revenues of \$7 million, representing an increase of \$200,000 over 2022. Net revenues were \$2 million. Our lotteries continue to serve as an important source of revenue in support of equipment purchases, facility upgrades, and other initiatives at HSC.

On **January 19, 2024**, our 18th annual **Innovation HSC Radiothon**, presented by **Maric Homes**, raised over \$214,000 in support of patient care. The day was full of radio interviews with patients, donors, health care leaders, and Foundation representatives. The Innovation HSC Radiothon is an important story-telling showcase of our donors' impact. For more photos, see pages 12–13.



On **February 24, 2024**, a sold-out crowd of nearly 800 guests gathered for **Savour Greece: Wine & Food Experience**, presented by **Garcea Group of Companies**. It was a fun and successful event that raised over \$830,000, including funds for new, state-of-the-art indocyanine green angiography equipment to help surgeons detect interruptions in blood flow during surgeries. We shared the podium with Minister of Health, Seniors and Long-Term Care Uzoma Asagwara on **March 26, 2024**, as we joined the Province of Manitoba in officially unveiling the new Epilepsy Monitoring Unit and the adjacent **Unit B5B**, which was funded by our donors and lottery supporters. Unit B5B is a state-of-the-art surgical step-down unit for neurosurgery patients, including patients undergoing procedures for epilepsy.

By **March 31**, our fifth **Innovation HSC annual campaign** surpassed its \$2,352,000 goal, raising a total of \$2,629,363 in support of the acquisition of new hospital equipment.

This is simply better for patients, especially rural patients who can now avoid multiple trips to the city. I believe HSC is setting the standard in thoracic care in Canada.”

After some time as a bedside nurse, I moved into a series of administrative and leadership roles. “For me, momentum is about taking regular steps forward to improve the patient experience and their care. A few months after I started working at HSC 20 years ago, the hospital got new operating rooms which were badly needed at the time, and there has been more positive progress ever since. I am especially excited about what is next for urology patients. Thanks to HSC Foundation donors, we will soon have the capacity to treat more patients—more quickly—because of new equipment and expanded space for the Manitoba Urologic Centre. With our new minimally invasive tools, many more people will be treated as outpatients in our procedure room as opposed to inpatient surgery and a few days of recovery in a hospital bed. The outcomes are better, there is less blood loss, less pain, and less need for narcotics. The advancements with technology and spaces also give us licence to innovate and consider new approaches for patients with kidney stones, bladder problems, prostate issues, and other urologic conditions.”

Looking Inside

Powerful visualization and minimally invasive surgery at the foundation of surgical excellence

In 1806, German physician Philipp Bozzini developed the “lichtleiter”, a light conductor to look inside the human body. Dr. Bozzini equipped an aluminum tube with mirrors that reflected candlelight through an orifice in the body and then sent an image out. The device is considered by many to be the first endoscope, and it proved to be quite useful in gynecology and urology.

Medical technology has come a long way since the lichtleiter, but the principles remain the same. To diagnose and to operate, you need to be able to see the organs and structures of the human body.

“Effective visualization is the key to surgical success and improved patient outcomes,” says Dr. Ed Buchel, Surgery Site Director at HSC. “Some of the advanced endoscopy tools we have now—made possible with investments by the HSC Foundation’s Operation Excellence campaign—can provide better views of the anatomy than human eyes alone. We can see a patient’s organs enlarged on high-definition monitors and that allows us to be even more precise when we operate.”

Prior to recent generations of endoscopic and minimally invasive surgical equipment, many more surgeries needed to be “open” so surgeons could see their work, explains Dr. Buchel. Surgeons needed to make large incisions and deliberately inflict other damage on the body—like spreading ribs, breaking a bone, or cutting through muscle—in order to operate (and, to be clear, some situations still require conventional open surgery). “These are the things that cause pain and require narcotics and longer recoveries in hospital and at home,” says Dr. Buchel. “The actual repair of the organ produces comparatively little pain. It’s getting to the organ that’s the issue.”

With the new scopes and small instruments made possible by Operation Excellence, the incisions are small and the pain is dramatically reduced, as is the risk of infection and other complications. In a growing number of cases, flexible scopes can navigate around structures and have zero impact on bone and muscle. With minimally invasive procedures, hospital stays are much shorter and some patients can even go home on the same day.



The Operation Excellence campaign has already enabled the purchase of several pieces of state-of-the-art visualization and minimally invasive surgical equipment, including the Stryker Q-Guidance system with the Ziehm intraoperative 3D imaging system (pictured here). The technology offers real-time imaging and three-dimensional visualization to help surgeons make more informed decisions.

An additional benefit of the new technology is that procedures can be recorded (with patient consent), stored, and studied—individually and in aggregate—to inform future practice. “This is a remarkable support to research and medical education,” says Dr. Buchel. “We can analyze the performance of students and help them improve their technique, and we can look at global population data to help surgeons make better decisions about specific procedures.”

Dr. Buchel credits Operation Excellence for these important developments in surgical care at HSC. “The momentum has been building for a few years, but has really accelerated through the campaign,” he says. “My colleagues and I are grateful for these investments that are benefitting patients.”

Developments in the field are always ongoing, says Dr. Buchel. There are important advancements in robotics, for example, including machines that can provide haptic feedback to the surgeon—meaning they can produce sensations that mimic what a human hand would feel when manipulating tissue. This helps a surgeon make more precise movements while applying the appropriate amount of force.

“The science and technology will continue to evolve and patient outcomes will continue to improve,” says Dr. Buchel. “The equipment we will continue to acquire through Operation Excellence will position HSC to embrace the next generations of technology. That’s what delivering tomorrow’s health care, today, is all about.” ◇

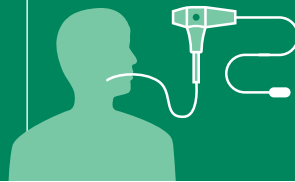

This funding is crucial for advancing patient care as it enhances our medical teams' knowledge and leads to improved diagnosis and treatment methods. Utilization of social work in Canadian emergency departments: an environmental scan

Thanks to the generous support of HSC Foundation donors, Anna Reed, a social worker in HSC's Adult Emergency Department, received a \$27,248 research grant in 2023 to elevate the practice of social work in the Emergency Department.

"This research that the Foundation is funding will equip us to provide even better care and service to our patients who need our support," says Reed.

With the grant, Reed launched a scoping study and environmental scan in December 2023. The study aims to investigate the role of social workers in emergency departments globally, as well as current practices among social workers working in similar community and emergency departments.

She says research pertaining to social work, especially in emergency department care, is critical to improve patient care at HSC as the emergency department is often the first touch point patients have with health care staff.

"Oftentimes, people equate social work with discharge planning, or supporting folks experiencing homelessness, which isn't wrong. We do that. But we also are involved in so many other ways in the hospital," Reed says.

She explains that emergency department social workers are often consulted on a wide range of situations including issues pertaining to domestic violence, assaults, elder abuse, addiction, pregnancy, pregnancy loss, grief, and motor vehicle accidents.

"Where do all these patients go when they first enter the hospital? The emergency department. And social workers are part of that interdisciplinary team that helps them right then and there," she says.

She adds that funding frontline medical research is so important, "because we're clinicians who are working on the frontlines, and we know what the issues are and what challenges we need to address right now."

As Reed continues to progress through the research, she is grateful for the support of the HSC Foundation.

"We're so grateful that the Foundation and its donors fund allied health research in social work, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, and other fields," she says. "We're an important part of health care." ♦

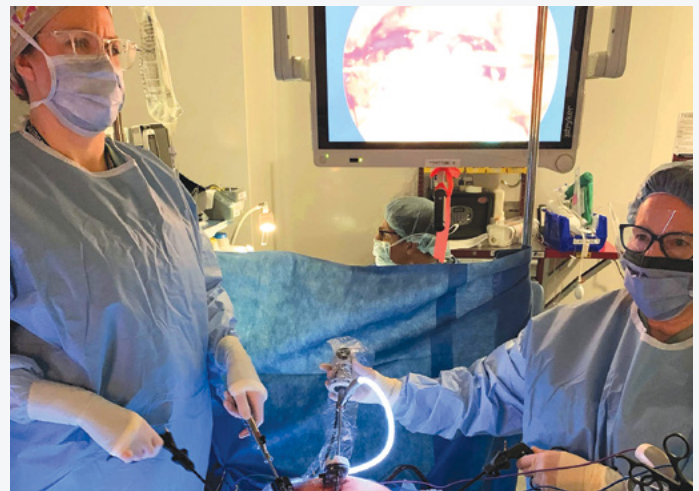

Planning for Success

“Momentum doesn’t just happen”

In the fall of 2024, the HSC Foundation Board of Directors and senior staff will gather to review and refresh the strategic plan that has guided the organization since 2020.

“I think our strategic plan has been central to our success as a foundation over the last few years,” says Jonathon Lyon, President and CEO of the HSC Foundation. “It has kept us laser-focused on advancing initiatives that will improve health care in Manitoba and provide HSC’s patients with the best possible experience.”

The initial process, which started in 2019, helped the organization assess challenges and opportunities, and articulate a grand vision to inspire donors. The process laid the groundwork for the launch of Operation Excellence, the largest and most ambitious campaign ever initiated by the Foundation.

“The strategic planning process helped us reflect on where we were as an organization, where we wanted to go, and how we needed to execute to get there,” says Tina Jones, C.M., O.M., HSC Foundation Board Chair. “In this

new process, we will look to leverage our recent successes to accomplish even greater things for Manitobans.”

The process articulated five goals (see box) with related strategic objectives. Tactics were developed under each strategic objective, and a tracking document is used to assess progress.

“Four times a year, before every Board meeting, we take a close look at what we have accomplished and adjust our tactics as required. We see the strategic plan as a living document,” says Lyon. “What we’ve learned along the way is that momentum doesn’t just happen. You need the grounding influence of a good and realistic plan, the right tactics, and the ability to seize opportunities that are consistent with your strategy.”

“Our vision is ‘tomorrow’s health care, today.’ It’s our North Star,” says Jones. “With an ongoing commitment to strategic planning, our vision will become reality.” ◇

Building for Excellence

Clinic acquisition positions HSC for future redevelopment

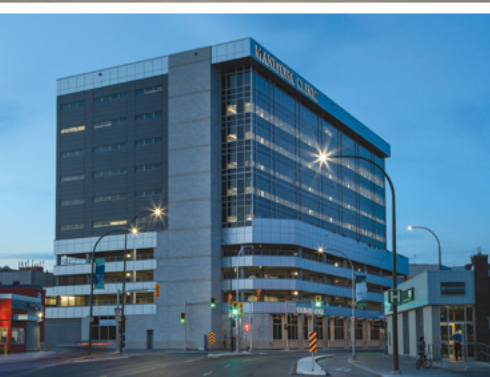
The Health Sciences Centre Foundation acquired the Manitoba Clinic building on December 13, 2023.

The Foundation purchased this modern, 150,000-square foot facility as a way to support future HSC campus redevelopment. About half the building will be used to house select HSC services and clinics as new facilities are developed in the future. In the meantime, the building is fully leased and generating income for the Foundation which can be used to support patient care initiatives at HSC. The building was purchased with credit facilities; no donor dollars were used.

“This is an unconventional move for a hospital foundation,” says Jonathon Lyon, President & CEO of the HSC Foundation. “We aren’t in the real estate business, but we are in the business of helping HSC innovate so that Manitobans can receive the best care possible. The building will act as a catalyst for HSC to achieve this goal.”

The Manitoba Clinic building, which entered creditor protection in 2022, was built in 2017. It is a 10-storey facility that includes three parking levels, retail, and medical offices. The initial agreement to acquire the property was announced in August 2023; the effort was led by the HSC Foundation Board and spearheaded by Chief Financial Officer, Paul Cadieux.

“Our Board and staff did an outstanding job to ensure that this deal made sense for the Foundation, the hospital, and for patients. And it absolutely does,” says Foundation Board Chair, Tina Jones, C.M., O.M. “To continue to excel as a foundation, we need to innovate and think outside of the box. The purchase of this stunning, modern building aligns very well with our vision of helping HSC deliver tomorrow’s health care, today.” ◇

Restoring Momentum for Manitobans

A reflection on excellent care

After discharge, Andrée-Anne Boisvert's recovery took about four months: "I've been cancer-free ever since, and I feel great. In fact, as you are reading this, I might be doing Pilates or taking a hike."

When you are struck with an injury or an illness, your life is disrupted. Your personal progress and momentum—your career, your relationships, your aspirations, and your pleasures—are immediately suspended in time. Like so many other Manitobans, I know this first-hand.

In 2021, I was diagnosed with stage 3B cervical cancer at the age of 36—a devastating diagnosis. I was initially treated with chemotherapy and radiation. The treatments knocked the heck out of me and, well, didn't work. Major surgery, including a radical hysterectomy at HSC Women's Hospital, was the only possible solution.

I was in hospital for a total of 18 days; three days before surgery and 15 after. I can't think back on my experience without getting emotional—not because of the life-altering nature of my surgery, but because of the compassion that defined my care. I knew the surgeons, nurses, aides, and staff were working under tremendous stress as the pandemic raged on, but you could hardly tell. When they were with me, all that mattered to them was my recovery and my well-being.

My dad has since passed away. I know how difficult my illness was for him; and I know how much gratitude he felt for the support we all received.

As I prepared for surgery and throughout my recovery, I was determined not only to be rid of cancer, but to get back to living life to the fullest. To get my momentum back. After my discharge, my complete recovery took about four months. I've been cancer-free ever since, and I feel great. In fact, as you are reading this, I might be doing Pilates or taking a hike.
